Burmese border BPS9C907 protest in doubt

Mae Sai - Planned antigovernment demonstrations and a general strike in Burma's border district of Thachilek today and tomorrow may be cancelled, apparently because of threats from the Burmese military, sources said yes-

terday.

Burmese soldiers, de-ployed in Thachilek opposite here, have made "un-usual moves" to thwart student-led protests be-cause an unidentified government official was expected to visit the district tomorrow, sources quoted a Burmese stu-dent leader as saying.

Burmese soldiers were seen repairing a road between a local airport and downtown Thachilek, while students were or-dered not to call any antigovernment demonstra-tions, they said.

Rumours were spreading in the border district that the Burmese military would stage a coup if protests Burma. continue

Meanwhile, authorities here have indefinitely sealed the Thai border with Thachilek, barring Thais from crossing. The Mae Sai-Thachilek border has been closed since the end of last month.
