Villagers return to border pass

MORE than 100 Kanchanaburi villagers have returned to their border community after the military promised to protect them amid clashes between Burmese minorities.

The villagers were among 500 who fled Ban Phra Chedi Sam-ong (Three Pagoda Pass) two months ago when Karen and Mon guerrillas started fighting for control of

the lucrative black market at the Burmese border pass.

Troops have cleared the area of landmines and booby traps but several houses were damaged during the fighting.
